RidePermit at a Glance

A free digital e-bike permit for California families, earned through short safety training.

What it is

RidePermit is a free digital e-bike permitting and safety-training platform for California families and school districts. A parent enrolls a student, the student completes safety training and a quiz, and the family receives a free digital permit — with an optional physical decal. Education-first: no plates, no mandate, no cost to families or districts.

How a family gets a permit

- 1 Parent creates an account and verifies email.
- 2 Parent adds a student and confirms e-bike eligibility.
- 3 Student completes safety training and a 5-question quiz (pass 4 of 5).
- 4 Parent signs a penalty-of-perjury attestation.
- 5 Family receives a free digital permit; optional physical decal available.

The model

- Digital permit: always free.
- Optional physical decal: \$25 new / \$15 renewal.
- Cost to school districts: free. No procurement contracts, no per-student fees.
- Built by LexBran Group, LLC; founded by Anthony 'Tony' Bright.

Why it matters

- Youth e-bike injuries have surged — Children's Hospital of Orange County reports e-bike-related injury cases up more than 1,500% in recent years.
- A 2024 Orange County Grand Jury found all 34 county cities under different e-bike rules.
- Designed to align with the direction of AB 1569 (Davies/Chen).

Key facts

- Public launch: July 20, 2026.
- Coverage: California (statewide-capable), initial focus Orange County.
- Training: short course + 5-question quiz, 4/5 to pass, signed attestation.
